

As we wait for October 11th we will continue our service on the lawn at 9:00 am. We will also continue our online service and FM broadcast. These will continue even after we return to inside of the building.

Above all, pray for God's presence to await our gathering together.

As we return to in person worship inside these are important things to remember.

- 1. Our service of worship will begin in the sanctuary at 9:30 am.
- 2. The health screening and registration will still take place before you enter the sanctuary.
- 3. Ushers will seat all of us to maintain social distancing.
- 4. *To assist with that, those who need to use the elevator to access the sanctuary need to call the office (352-5705) by Thursday of each week and let us know, as the number of people using the elevator affects our parking and seating arrangements.
- 5. Everyone else, we ask that you come to the front doors (Court Street side) to enter the sanctuary.
- 6. We also are having a time of instruction and gathering for our Children and Youth during our time of worship. Parents can drop off and pick up their children at the upstairs doors above the Day Care entrance. (You can see more details about this in the article on the next page.)

We are excited to reintroduce handbell practice on Wednesday nights as well as handbell worship performances beginning October 11! PRAISE THE LORD!!!!

What the Good Samaritan did not do is: handle others' needs while ignoring his own, sabotage his plans because of the needs of others, decided that he was the only one who could meet the man's needs, require the injury man do anything in return for the help or avoid setting good boundaries with others involved.

Yes, codependency or unhealthy helping is a harmful habit. At Celebrate Recovery, you will find support in reaching a healthy combination of Galatians 6:5 (For each will have to bear his own load) and Philippians 2:4 (Don't look out only for your own interests, but take an interest in others, too).


