Church Council Minutes Memorial United Methodist Church Wednesday, July 22, 2020

Those in attendance were Sue Eggleston, Tom Conrad, Norm Ramsey, Sheila Webb, Doug Webb, Tom Hall, Marie Milton, Joan Holt, Kathy Dickerson, Kinckle Robinson, Leeann Robinson, Cindy Ranson, Dawn Elliott, Dan Turner, Blair Smith, Harry White, Mary Main, Steve Nadolson, Mitch Eggleston, and several ZOOM attendees.

Sue Eggleston called the meeting to order at 7:02 pm.

Leeann Robinson led devotions.....2 Peter 1:3. God will call yo to do what you can't do, but will provide you with what you need to do it.

June 2020 minutes were approved by consensus.

Ministry Reports

Kinckle Robinson (Finance).....We have had some additional expenses that have brought our bank balance down some. Estimate of giving is down. Building fund is holding steady.

It was discussed and agreed to keep ordering the offering envelopes.

Farmer's Bank safety deposit box issues have been resolved.

Blair Smith, Lay Leader.....Would like for handbells to start playing again since there is no singing allowed in church. Also would like to have an open house at the parsonage around Christmas.

George Bergdoll, Lay delegate to annual conference.....Annual Conference will be a ZOOM meeting on September 19th.

Marie Milton, Prayer Ministry and Parsonage Committee.....We have a lots of prayer needs lately. Parsonage move out/move in went as smoothly as possible in light of the renovations happening at the same time.

Steve Nadolson & Mary Main, Evangelism.....Things are slow right now as you can imagine. Looking forward to starting Kids Night again when possible. Want to start a library cart for sharing books with the congregation...this was approved by consensus.

Leeann Robinson, SS Superintendent.....Adult SS literature is available for pick-up.

Harry White, UMM.....The men plan to meet in August.

Tom Hall, Trustees.....Recommended we switch from Church Mutual Insurance to Brotherhood Mutual. Will save \$1500 per year and increase coverage. This was approved by vote.

Dan Turner, Property & Grounds.....Parsonage renovations are complete...original estimate of \$30K went to \$32K. Plus additional flooring, electrical, upstairs work, and landscaping that needed to be done, added another \$10k to the final figure. Most of the church building systems have remained stable, had to do work on one of the HVAC systems in the main church building. Hand sanitizer stations have been rented from Cintas for \$12 per week. Dan announced he will be stepping down as P & G chairman at the end of this year.

Doug Webb, SPRC.....Thanked all the volunteers for helping Norm and Karen move in all their furniture and other belongings.

Cindy Ranson, Daycare.....The Daycare is doing well and stayed healthy since opening up. No cases of covid-19. Currently the baby, toddler, and 3-year old and 4-year old rooms are running at capacity. Experiencing low numbers for the school kids. Received a CARES grant for \$8100 per month for being open during the pandemic (May and June).

Norman Ramsey.....Has enjoyed getting to meet a lot of folks. Would like for the church to take a look at a data base called "One Call Now", which will enable information to get out to all members of the church. Norm wants to thank Tori and Nick for their help in the on-line services. This Sunday, those listening to the service on their radios will need to tune into 98.9 FM.

Sheila Webb, Worship.....We have been offering on-line services over the past several months, and have purchased several pieces of equipment to facilitate this. The plan is to continue to offer this option even as we return to in-person worship. We will have our first hybrid worship service on the front lawn this Sunday with masks and social distancing required. Dan turner has constructed 2 wooden collection boxes for tithes and offerings to be collected in. Due to the uncertainty of future restrictions regarding worship, the Revival and Homecoming plans for September have been cancelled, and will be rescheduled for Spring of 2021. This was approved by consensus. Mike Rutland will be invited back as our guest preacher.

Norm Ramsey closed with prayer.

Meeting was adjourned at 8:50 pm.

-- Black or White / Police or Protestor / Man or Woman / Born or Unborn --


Our mission remains: "To change our world, by developing Christ followers, who love God, and love people."


