Yes, the world may fall apart and its systems crash with the passage of time. But, we will endure and remain steadfast in our faith. We will maintain our hope in Jesus Christ.


So, pursue the resolutions and goals God gives you remembering this: "All who have this hope in Him purify themselves, just as he is pure." (1 John 3: 3)

Those in attendance were Sue Eggleston, Mitch Eggleston, Norm Ramsey, Harry White, Nathan Putney, Marie Milton, Angie Dillon, Leeann Robinson, Rodney Deaner, Debby Long, Cindy Ranson, Sheila Webb, Bobby Waddell, Sue Waddell, Donna Deaner, Tom Gilliam.

Sue Eggleston called the meeting to order at 7:30 pm.

Sue Eggleston led devotions, "One Thing for Christmas", choose Jesus!

Minutes from November 2021 were approved.

Sue Eggleston (CC Chair)...Asked the group to call Kinckle with any questions about the finance report. Also, asked council if we should put the "budget figure" or the "estimate of giving" on the back of the bulletin....it was agreed to put the "budget figure". Leadership retreat is scheduled for 1/29. Newsletter deadline is 12/20.

Bobby Waddell said he would like to see all church leaders encouraging folks to get the covid vaccine. And he also has heard from a few people that are not coming to church because everyone is not wearing masks. Discussion followed, and it was also brought up that some people were not coming to church last year because we were required to wear masks, and that the vaccine was a personal decision and has not been mandated by the Bishop.

Donna Deaner asked the council to approve a time of 11:25 for SS classes to end, allowing the parents of children in these classes to know what time they need to pick up. This was approved.

Marie Milton asked council to approve having "coffee and conversation" once a month at the church on 2nd Satudays, the first being on 1/8 at 9:30 am. This was approved.

Norman brought up that the Carver Price Legacy Museum folks asked to use the sanctuary on the afternoon of 1/16, since the high school auditorium is under construction. This was approved.

Nathan and Brenda Putney (Prayer Ministry)...No prayer meeting on 12/27. Thanks to all who have been attending!

Angie Dillon and Cindy Ranson (Daycare)...Thing are going well. Santa visited, MDC employees had their Christmas Celebration. We will be closed 12/23-12/31, reopening on 1/3.

Debby Long and Marie Milton (Congregational Care)...Caravans visited senior members on 11/21. Another caravan scheduled for 12/19. A small gift will be given out to all members of the congregation Sunday 12/19.

Harry White (Congregational Care)...replacement for the Legacy Hall freezer will be delivered on 12/22. Fire Marshall made annual inspection of the church. Other projects completed are shade sails taken down, new water cooler purchased, daycare entrance light has been repaired, replaced 2 broken door stops, repaired other lights in daycare, defibrillators were sent out to be serviced, and are working to find an internal water leak. There has been a request for handicap seating in the sanctuary...Harry will check this out and report to council. Also reported that some lights are out in the fellowship area of Legacy Hall.

Bobby Waddell (SPRC)...Met on 12/1 and discussed modifications to job descriptions for employees. Hope to meet in January with new members. Recommended to the Bishop and

Cabinet that Norm be reappointed to Memorial for 2022.


Debby Long (Super Seniors)...On 12/1 enjoyed a trip to Rosefield Farm for lunch and a wreath making class. On 12/10 seniors enjoyed lunch at Legacy Hall along with singing Christmas carols. There will be a senior breakfast in January.

Norman Ramsey (Pastor)...requested council approve a love offering the next 2 Sundays in December and our Christmas Eve offering to go to disaster relief in Kentucky, where tornadoes have caused extensive damage. This was approved. Norm also thanked everyone for all the missions and activities happening at MUMC, and offered prayer requests for 2022 General Conference, for Bishop Sharma Lewis and her refocusing on evangelism and the gospel, and for discerning when the time is right to return to 2 services at MUMC.

Nathan Putney closed with prayer.

Sue Eggleston adjourned the meeting at 8:35 pm.

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#### Commit. Connect. Serve.

When a person joins the United Methodist Church, they enter into a covenant with God and the other church members to keep certain vows as part of the church family. You can look them up in The UMC Discipline, Article 217. I want to focus on vow #6: (I vow) "to faithfully participate in its ministries by (my) prayers, (my) presence, (my) gifts, (my) service, and (my) witness." You might ask, "How do I do all of this?"

- 1. Prayers. That's an easy one. Just remember to lift up your church and your church family in your prayers! Another way is to be a part of the church prayer ministry. Prayer meetings are held every other Monday night, 7 pm, in the Sanctuary and are open to anyone. You can volunteer to be a prayer usher that prays with people after our worship services. AND you can join the prayer chain that receives prayer requests by email. (Just notify Nathan and Brenda Putney at <a href="mailto:PrayerChainMUMC@yahoo.com">PrayerChainMUMC@yahoo.com</a> and you'll be added.)
- 2. Presence. That's an easy one. Just come to church. Worship. Sunday school. Other activities. All Christians benefit from spending time face-to-face with fellow Christians.
- 3. Gifts. The Bible tells us that God has given certain gifts (talents, resources, etc.) to each of us and we are called to share them with the church. This one is a little harder because we have to give of ourselves, perhaps even sacrifice, as God calls us to be a generous giver....of our resources, our time, our love.
- 4. Service. Another tough one. Again, we are called to give of ourselves....our time, our energy, our hands and feet. MUMC offers many opportunities to serve. You will receive great joy and purpose when you can match up your gifts with your service. I'll give some details of service opportunities down below.
- 5. Witness. You may have heard the expression, "Your actions may be the only Bible some folks read." We need to witness the truth of the Gospel and the love of Jesus Christ in how we act and how we speak. Some may have the gift of evangelism and be able to share their faith with those around them. People are watching us. Let's try to be good representatives of Jesus all the time....at work, at home, on social media, etc.

Here are current ministries at MUMC and how you can COMMIT, CONNECT, and SERVE:

Worship Committee (Help by greeting, ushering, sound system, monitors, acolyting, worship assistant), Music (choir, hand bells, solo/ensemble music), Homebound Communion (join the teams that visit our homebound members monthly to deliver Holy Communion), Worship Arts (planning creative elements for our worship services), Flower Committee (planning, decorating, and taking care of flowers for church), Congregational Care Committee (caravans, super seniors, first Fridays, Helping Hands), Hospitality Team (planning congregational meals), Bereavement Team (planning meals for bereaved families), Holy Grounds (providing breakfast dishes to share), Evangelism Committee (monitoring church attendance, gift bags for visitors, informational brochures for visitors, reaching out in community), Celebrate Recovery Team (Tuesday night meetings to help folks break bad habits), Missions Committee (planning opportunities to serve and give to those in need...locally and worldwide), Christian Education (volunteer to teach Sunday school, Bible studies...participate in Sunday school and Bible studies), Nursery/Children's Church (coordinate volunteers, volunteer!), United Methodist Men (join the guys as they take on various projects each year....Pancake Supper, Cook-outs, etc.), Property & Grounds (join the team that helps take care of our buildings and landscaping...handyman jobs, a multitude of needs, night security details), Bible Time (reading Bible stories to the daycare children), Communications (get involved with our website, Facebook, creating flyers, etc.), volunteering to help out in the church office.... OR you can initiate a new ministry!!

You've probably heard that at C/R, we work to acknowledge our hurts, hang-ups, and harmful habits. We relay on Biblical principles to address our 3h's while reaching for a renewed life. One of the tools we use is building healthy boundaries. Dr. Henry Cloud literally wrote the book on *Boundaries*. Here are his thoughts:

Boundaries define us. They define what is me and what is not me. Boundaries help us keep the good in and the bad out. Setting boundaries inevitably involves taking responsibility for your choices. You are the one who makes them. You are the one who must live with their consequences. And you are the one who may be keeping yourself from making the choices you could be happy with. We must own our own thoughts and clarify distorted thinking.



What is a boundary, and how do we build them, you ask?

A picture is worth a thousand words.

Picture your boundary as building a fence. First, the structure is constructed on your property, not your neighbors. Your effort should be focused on you.

Now, what does it take to build a fence?

Posts, Boards, nails and following Jesus' example as your blueprint.

Start with the posts. The post on your fence is forgiveness. Jesus quoted Leviticus 19:18 "Do not seek revenge or bear a grudge against anyone among your people, but love your neighbor as yourself." Another example: as he hung dying on the cross, Jesus asked that those who nailed him there be forgiven.

The boards for the fence reflect the actions of Jesus in grace, peace, understanding, and self-control. Here are a couple of examples of Jesus setting boundaries. To the woman caught in adultery, he showed grace ("Neither do I condemn you.") and boundaries. ("Go and sin no more."). To the Pharisees who condemned the woman, Jesus listened and set boundaries. ("Let him who is without sin throw the first stone.") (John 8:1-11)

Jesus' parable of the Father of a prodigal son is also illustrates setting boundaries with forgiveness in peace, love, grace, understanding, and personal choices. The Father sent his son away but forgave him, prayed for him, and welcomed his repenting son back. (Luke 15:11-33)

The last needed element in building your fence is nails; nails to hold the boards to the posts. Prayer and discerning God's plan are your nails. Matthew 6:6 tells us to go into your room, close the door and pray to your Father. (Matthew 6:6) The best fences are built based on God's plans.



Fences can be unfriendly barricades



Or they can be a pleasant way of setting off and protecting God's plan for your life.






