Let us pray, "Lord, let your redeeming work begin in me."



Sue Eggleston called the meeting to order at 7:02 pm.

Rodney Deaner led devotions....God is Almighty! Genesis 35:11.

There were no July 2021 minutes since we did not meet. Reports were sent in.

Kinckle Robinson (Finance)...Things are going along smoothly. Giving is a little less YTD than anticipated.

Casey Vandgrift... Wants to start Feeding Appomattox, a program that will provide Thanksgiving meals to homebound and low-income persons/families in Appomattox. Will need plenty of volunteers! CC approved.

Sue Eggleston (CC Chair)...Tori Rothgeb wants to use the church parking lot on 9/11 from 10-2...CC approved. Harry White will be changing the door code at Legacy Hall. Charge Conference is 11/17 in Farmville, changing our November CC meeting to Tuesday 11/16. Lay Leadership team is meeting to set the 2022 leadership for the church.

Bobby Waddell (SPRC)...Recommended a 4% increase for employees. Moving forward with filling the administrative assistant position.

Sue Waddell (Missions)...We took in \$2700 for Honduras, and \$3500 for Guatemala.

Norm Ramsey (Pastor)...Pray for the nominating committee as they meet. Also, pray for the conference and the church.

Nathan and Brenda Putney (Prayer)...Thanks to the prayer ushers, and to those attending bi-weekly Monday prayer services (next is on 8/23).

Angie Dillon and Cindy Ranson (Daycare)...Play areas are done and getting new mulch. Masks are now required by the DOE. Daycare Committee would like to have an application for parents to complete when they can't pay, and the ramifications of doing so...CC approved.

Debby Long and Marie Milton (Congregational Care)...A meal train has been set-up for Karen Ramsey for after her upcoming surgery.

Sheila Webb and Cindy Ranson (Worship)...Kathy Dickerson has made a new covering for the communion table. Replacement mics have been ordered. It was decided not to do the "greeting" at the beginning of worship... people are encouraged to visit at Holy Grounds. Bryan reported that a return to full choir has been postponed due to covid, will try to add small groups of singers into the service. Holy Grounds will begin in September at 9:30, with only pastries and coffee. Beginning in October, classes can choose what they wish to serve, keeping in mind that being on time for Worship is a top priority. A committee was put together to work on details for Homecoming on 11/21, which will have a catered lunch...\$2000 in budget for revival will be used for Homecoming meal....CC approved. Beginning in September the new worship schedule is 9:30 Holy Grounds, 10-10:45 Worship, and 11-11:45 SS.

Debby Long (Super Seniors)...Met in July for Breakfast at Railyard, and will be doing this again on Friday 8/27. Planning a September picnic with musical entertainment.

Harry White (P & G)...All switches, receptacles and cover platers at the parsonage have been replaced. Facia above sanctuary entrance has been repaired/replaced. Planning to repair stained glass window in steeple. Steeple and trim will be painted this fall at a cost of about \$3000. Ceiling panels in Daycare were tested for asbestos and were found asbestos-free. Looking into a new water cooler for the kids SS hallway....this would cost about \$1300. Researching alternatives to Cintas services and how we can reduce costs. Wand has been broken again on the covid backpack mister....Jimmy is ordering a new one.

Donna Deaner and Leeann Robinson (Education)...There is a 9-week Women's Bible study starting 9/16 (Sermon on the Mount by Jen Wilkins). If anyone would like to facilitate a Bible study, please contact Donna or Leeann. Starting in September, Children's worship will be provided for children 4 years to 3rd grade. Children will begin Worship in sanctuary with parents, and be dismissed after the scripture reading. Nursery for infants to 3 year olds will be provided during Worship. Adventure SS for the children in August is going well!

Mitch Eggleston closed in prayer.

Sue Eggleston adjourned the meeting at 7:58 pm.

Dear Friends,




